20th January is Peace Sunday

Every year Pax Christi promotes the Holy Father's World Peace Day Message on 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The theme of this year's Peace Sunday is "Good politics serves peace". In his message for the World Day of Peace on 1st January, the Holy Father said this: "One thing is certain: good politics is at the service of peace. It respects and promotes fundamental human rights, which are at the same time mutual obligations, enabling a bond of trust and gratitude to be forged between present and future generations....today more than ever, our societies need "artisans of peace" who can be messengers and authentic witnesses of God the Father, who wills the good and the happiness of the human family."

27th January 2019 - Holocaust Memorial Day

The theme of this year's Holocaust Memorial Day is 'Torn from Home' and encourages us to reflect on how the enforced loss of a safe place to call 'home' is part of the trauma faced by anyone experiencing persecution and genocide. 'Home' usually means a place of safety, comfort and security. On Holocaust Memorial Day 2019 we will reflect on what happens when individuals, families and communities are driven out of, or wrenched from their homes, because of persecution or the threat of genocide, alongside the continuing difficulties survivors face as they try to find and build new homes when the genocide is over.
