The Chrism Mass is the special Liturgy in Holy Week at which the Bishop blesses the three Holy Oils used in the Sacraments: The Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Blessing of the Sick and the Oil of Chrism. The blessing of the Holy Oils is one of the most ancient ceremonies of the Church and it's always celebrated in the Cathedral with the priests, deacons, religious and lay people of the diocese. This year, the Chrism Mass is on Tuesday 16th April at 11 o'clock in the Cathedral. During it, all the priests make a renewal of their commitment to priestly service

Next week is Holy Week! We begin with Palm Sunday, a 'bitter-sweet' celebration of the Lord's entry into Jerusalem: 'bitter,' because in a few days' time, the acclamations of the crowds will turn to screams of rage for His death, 'sweet,' because He is our King and by His resurrection, He frees us from sin, suffering, death. The palms remind us Christ our King has triumphed. In the Gospel at Mass on Monday, Jesus goes to Bethany, where, alluding to His burial, Mary anoints His feet with costly oil. On Tuesday, Jesus is at supper, troubled that one of The Twelve will betray Him and another deny Him. Then on Wednesday, Judas 'seals the deal' to hand Him over. And on Thursday the Triduum begins, the Sacred Three Days of His death and resurrection, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Passion on Good Friday, the descent into hell and the glory of Easter. The Triduum is a single celebration, the Liturgy of the Passover, the passing-over of Jesus from death to life. By His passing-over, Jesus transforms human life and makes that transformation available to us, through His Church, feeding us with His life-giving Body and Blood. Please keep Holy Week 'holy' by your prayers each day, by reflecting on the daily readings from the Gospels, and by going to Mass and Confession (if you have not done already). I wish you a happy Holy Week and Easter. Bishop Philip
